## SCOTDANCE CANADA CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES 2026 MONCTON

### GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All dancing events will be governed by the rules and regulations of the Royal Scottish Official Board of Highland Dancing (RSOBHD) and ScotDance Canada.
2. Dancers will compete in inverse order of entry, except for the Canadian Championship.
3. The decision of the judges is final.
4. Age is as of 12.01am on July 5<sup>th</sup>, 2026, except for the Canadian Championship.
5. Age for the Canadian Championship is to be taken as of 12.01am on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026.
6. Dancers will retain the same status over the 5-day event.
7. Prior to July 5<sup>th</sup>, 2026 all Status/Category changes must be emailed to [SDCCSreg2026@gmail.com](mailto:SDCCSreg2026@gmail.com).
8. All event additions must be completed via the online registration portal by the 8<sup>th</sup> June, 2026 deadline.
9. Any changes to category, status, or the addition of events received after June 8th, 2026 may not be reflected in the programme.
10. In order to compete, dancers must be registered with the RSOBHD or RSOBHD subsidiary body (such as ScotDance Canada). All competitors must present their current RSOBHD registration card at the registration table on the day of registration for this event. Any dancer unable to show a valid registration card will pay a \$10.00 fee to the organiser and will forfeit all awards until such time as the card is produced. If the card is not produced within 10 days, their name will be passed on to all Organisers who will be advised not to accept entries from the dancer or allow them to compete until such matters are satisfactorily resolved.
11. Registration for all dancers and all events commences on Sunday, July 5<sup>th</sup>, 2026. Dancers' numbers, schedules, pre-ordered social event tickets, pre-ordered souvenir programmes and other souvenir items will be available at this time. For the remainder of the week, registration will be held for a limited time each morning.
12. Dancers must remain in **full costume** to receive awards and be present in the group photo.
13. Dancers will be required to fill in for Reels as necessary and must dance the entire dance.
14. Dancers reporting late for their dance will not be allowed to dance out of draw/numerical sequence.
15. The Organiser reserves the right to combine or divide classes depending upon entries received.
16. Only those with proper accreditation will be allowed behind-the-stage access.
17. Abusive behaviour, both online and in-person will not be tolerated.
18. Protests must be made in writing, giving the complainant's full name and address, and shall be given directly to the Organiser, if possible, on the day of the event and not later than 48 hours after the Event takes place. Such a complaint must be accompanied by a deposit of \$35, refundable if the complaint is upheld.

## SCOTDANCE CANADA CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES 2026 MONCTON

### **SDC AND RSOBHD RISK MANAGEMENT POLICIES/RULES**

19. In accordance with the ScotDance Canada Risk Management Policies, dancers must not change costumes in public view or in public washrooms. Dancers must use the provided secured changing facilities ONLY. Dancers must also abide by the RSOBHD Code of Ethics which states that dancers will dress appropriately and modestly when in public at competitions. Dancers in violation of these policies will be asked to leave the area until properly dressed and will have their names forwarded to the SDC Risk Management Committee and the RSOBHD where further action may be taken.

### **GENERAL CHAMPIONSHIP RULES**

20. These events have been sanctioned and will be governed by the rules and regulations of the Royal Scottish Official Board of Highland Dancing (RSOBHD).
21. The 2026 Championship steps must be danced for the Canadian Championship and the ScotDance Canada Open Championship.

### **CANADIAN CHAMPIONSHIP RULES**

22. There will be a draw for the order of dance for the Canadian Championship. This draw will take place after entries close and will be supervised by a representative of ScotDance Canada.
23. Provincial Representatives must be entered by their respective ScotDance Provincial Affiliate or Provincial Championship Organiser.
24. Substitution of a Provincial Representative is allowed up to 5:00 PM ADT, Sunday, July 6<sup>th</sup>, 2026 (the day prior to the Canadian Championship). If available, both dancers would be able to participate in the Parade of Champions. All issues with regards to this substitution are the responsibility of the Provincial Affiliate.

The following process must be followed for the substitution to be allowed:

- a. A letter must be sent from the Provincial Affiliate to ScotDance Canada and SDCCS 2026 advising both organisations of the substitution. This must come from the Provincial Affiliate. No arrangements should be made without receiving permission from ScotDance Canada first. The reason for substituting a representative must be outlined in the letter to ScotDance Canada and SDCCS 2026.
- b. All substitution details are the sole responsibility of the Provincial Affiliate. This includes but is not limited to such things as banquet tickets. ScotDance Canada and SDCCS 2026 are not responsible for providing or accommodating any requests with regards to Provincial Representative substitutions.
- c. The substitution in no way can interrupt or delay the proceedings of the Canadian Championship.

## SCOTDANCE CANADA CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES 2026 MONCTON

### PRE-CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

25. Pre-Championships are open to Premier dancers who have never won a Championship or Pre-Championship event. Provincial Representatives in the Canadian Championship may be eligible if this rule applies.
26. Premier and Restricted Premier dancers competing in the **Under 12 years sections** must choose to enter the Pre-Championship or the ScotDance Canada Open Championship on July 9<sup>th</sup>, 2026; **not both**.
27. Premier and Restricted Premier dancers competing in the **12 years & Over sections** may choose to enter the Pre-Championship and/or the ScotDance Canada Open Championship on July 9<sup>th</sup>, 2026.

### RESTRICTED PREMIER RULES

28. A Restricted Premier dancer is defined as one who has not won an overall trophy in a Premier or Restricted Premier class for two (2) years preceding the date of the Restricted Premier event the dancer is entering (from July 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024 to July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2026, inclusive). Provincial Representatives in the Canadian Championship may be eligible if this rule applies.
29. ScotDance Canada defines an OVERALL TROPHY win for Restricted Premier purposes as, “the dancer with the highest total number of points having competed in more than one (1) individual dance in a Premier competition age group that has six (6) or more competitors, thus the name High Aggregate Trophy.” Winners of special dances such as a Special Hornpipe, Special Jig, or Choreography event DO NOT qualify as an overall trophy win. A Championship, Premiership, and Pre-Championship are all considered to be Premier events.
30. Dancers must choose either Premier or Restricted Premier for both Highland and National events. Dancers cannot elect to dance in Premier Highland and then Restricted National or vice versa.

### PREMIER SPECIAL EVENT RULES - IRISH JIG CHALLENGE HONOURING IRENE BAIRD

31. Open to all Premier dancers, including Restricted Premier dancers.
32. Irish Jig steps to be a 3&1.
33. No set steps. Steps as per RSOBHD textbook.
34. Age groups and number of Special Awards will be based on entries.
35. The top 6 dancers in each class will advance to the finals, where a 3&1 step Irish Jig will be danced. Dancers will be divided into 3 age categories for the finals.
36. Special awards and prize money (CAD) will be given to the top 6 finalists in each of the final 3 age categories.
37. Premier Special Events do not count towards aggregate awards.

## SCOTDANCE CANADA CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES 2026 MONCTON

### PREMIER SPECIAL EVENT RULES - INTERNATIONAL BROADSWORD CHALLENGE

38. Open to all Premier dancers, including Restricted Premier dancers.
39. All dancers must enter as an individual.
40. Classes will be split into 4 age categories.
41. Teams will be organized July 5<sup>th</sup>, 2026 in the line-up area, in order of individual entries received (first to enter, last to dance).
42. Teams will be provided with 30 minutes to rehearse in the line-up area prior to the commencement of the event.
43. In the event of insufficient dancers for the final set of Broadswords in each class, fill-ins will be used from dancers who have entered first within each category. Dancers who enter first may have more than one opportunity to compete for prizes.
44. Set steps will be required. Steps and video will be posted on [www.sdccs.ca](http://www.sdccs.ca).

### PRE-PREMIER SPECIAL EVENT RULES

45. Open to all Beginner, Novice, and Intermediate dancers.
46. No set steps. Steps as per RSOBHD textbooks.
47. Beginner and Novice will dance a 4 step Highland Fling.
48. Intermediate will dance a 4 step Sailors Hornpipe.
49. Age groups and number of Special Awards will be based on entries.
50. Pre-premier Special Events do not count towards aggregate awards.

### GENERAL CHOREOGRAPHY RULES

51. All dancers must be registered with RSOBHD or RSOBHD subsidiary body as noted in Rule 10.
52. Online Entry Acceptance Date –March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2026. No entries will be accepted prior to this date. Entries will be accepted online until June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2026, or earlier if maximum number of registrations received.
53. Solos, Duets, and Groups may use props during their performance, either static or non-static, provided they do not require set-up or take-down. Live animals are not permitted.
54. Average age will be determined based on the age of the dancer on July 5<sup>th</sup>, 2026.
55. Where applicable, all music must be submitted electronically by June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2026 to [sdccs2026music@gmail.com](mailto:sdccs2026music@gmail.com). Please bring a backup copy on a memory stick to the event. No verbal communication with the sound technician will be permitted during the actual competition.
56. A waitlist will be established if: More than 100 Premier Solos, 60 Open Duets, 36 Small Group, or 36 Large Group entries are received. To join waitlist, click the hourglass icon by the event in the online registration portal to initiate your waitlist request.
57. If, after entering, circumstances prevent your solo, duet, small, or large group from participating, please email [SDCCSreg2026@gmail.com](mailto:SDCCSreg2026@gmail.com) as soon as possible to allow another entry from the waitlist to compete.
58. Additional entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Organiser.
59. Stage dimensions and additional information will be published on [www.sdccs.ca](http://www.sdccs.ca).

## SCOTDANCE CANADA CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES 2026 MONCTON

60. Dancers may enter both solos and duets, however, dancers may not enter more than one solo or more than one duet.
61. In addition to solos and duets, individual dancers may enter a maximum of one Small Group and one Large Group Choreography.
62. All dancers (if of legal age) or parents of minor dancers participating only in choreography events and no other SDCCS dance events will be emailed the SDCCS event waiver for acknowledgement in order to compete in the choreography events.

### PREMIER CHOREOGRAPHY SOLO RULES

63. Open to all Premier dancers, including Restricted Premier dancers.
64. Music time limit is 1.5 minutes (1m 30s) including entrance and exit.

### OPEN CHOREOGRAPHY DUET RULES

65. Open to all Primary, Beginner, Novice, Intermediate, Premier, and Restricted Premier dancers. Categories will be combined as one Open category.
66. Only one dancer is required to enter the duet and must list the name, age, date of birth, dance teacher(s), and RSOBHD card number of their duet partner on the entry form.
67. Average age will be determined based on the age of the dancer on July 5, 2026.
68. A set piece of music will be provided. Music will be available for download on the event website [www.sdccs.ca](http://www.sdccs.ca)

### GROUP CHOREOGRAPHY RULES

69. Open to all dancers (Pre-Premier, Restricted Premier and Premier) with current year RSOBHD registration cards.
70. The Group Choreography entry form must be completed by the teacher.
71. Each Group Choreography entry must be submitted online on a separate entry form and list the names of ALL professionals (teachers/studios) involved.
72. Judges who have students participating in team/joint choreographies must abide by the three (3) month teaching/judging rules as stipulated in the RSOBHD Constitution and Rules Book.
73. Dancer demographic information is not required at the time of registration.
74. The Google Form with Dancers' full names, dates of birth, ages and RSOBHD dancer card numbers must be submitted within one (1) week of registration. For example, if a teacher submits the entry on April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026, the Google Form must be submitted by April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2026.

75. Failure to send complete dancer information within one week of registration will result in cancellation of entry with notice.
76. Small Group is 3-7 dancers with a maximum of 2.5 minutes (2m 30s) including entrances and exits.
77. Large Group is 8 or more dancers with a maximum of 3 minutes including entrances and exits.

## SCOTDANCE CANADA CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES 2026 MONCTON

78. Entries will be divided into a maximum of four age categories for Small Groups. Large Group entries will be divided into a maximum of two groups. Average age per group will determine age categories.
79. Substitution of dancers will be allowed up to June 8<sup>th</sup>, 2026. Please email [SDCCSreg2026@gmail.com](mailto:SDCCSreg2026@gmail.com) with details of dancer(s) withdrawing along with requested details on substitute dancer(s).

### **IRENE BAIRD BEST OVERSEAS DANCER TROPHY RULES**

80. The Irene Baird Best Overseas Dancer Trophy is awarded to the Premier dancer who permanently resides outside of North America and accumulates the most points overall in the ScotDance Canada Championship Series events, excluding the Choreography and Special Events. Should a dancer enter two competitions on the same day, e.g. the Pre-Championship and the ScotDance Canada Open Championship, only the results from the dancer's most successful competition will be used in calculation towards the Best Overseas Dancer Trophy.

### **ALEX AND MAY MARTIN TROPHY RULES**

81. Introduced in 1995, the Alex and May Martin Trophy is awarded annually to the Premier dancer who permanently resides in North America and accumulates the most points overall in the ScotDance Canada Championship Series events, excluding the Canadian Championship, Choreography and Special Events. Should a dancer enter two competitions on the same day, e.g. the Pre-Championship and the ScotDance Canada Open Championship, only the results from the dancer's most successful competition will be used in calculation towards the Alex and May Martin Trophy.

### **ADELINE DUNCAN DANCER OF THE DAY RULES**

82. The Adeline Duncan Dancer of the Day award will be awarded to the dancer (or dancers in the event of a tie) with the highest dance points as determined from the total dance points obtained from the four Championship dances within the Canadian Championship in each age category (7 age groups).

### **GENERAL AUDIENCE SEATING RULES**

83. Limit of 1 small bag per person. No large dance bags or garment bags will be permitted in the general seating area.
84. Placing bags or clothing on seats will not be permitted.
85. No warming up in the seating area.
86. No dance mats, boards or dance bags are permitted in the public areas of the Avenir Centre.
87. No parents behind the stage area. Only professionals and volunteers with proper accreditation will be permitted access.
88. Videotaping of your dancer will be permitted in designated areas only and must not interfere with official event photography or videography.
